Each year Kent School District spends an average of \$16,177 per student.

The levy is not a new tax. Voters are deciding on renewing an expiring tax that provides local funding to Kent School District for critical needs not covered by state and federal funding.

Our local levy and bond dollars, when approved by voters, provide funds that stay in our district and help our students. The proposed levy would make up approximately 16 percent of district revenue. Failure to renew this levy will mean significant reductions in staff, programs, and services for students.

Having good schools and facilities has a positive effect on our neighborhoods. Better schools help build a stronger community, which will improve our quality of life, keep crime down, and help increase the value of our homes.

All students should be given the same opportunities regardless of their abilities, backgrounds, or family income. This funding will allow students in Kent School District to have the same opportunities to learn, grow and succeed.

PROPOSITION NO. 1 | KENT SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 415 REPLACEMENT OF EXPIRING EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AND OPERATIONS LEVY

The Board of Directors of Kent School District No. 415 adopted Resolution No. 1614, concerning a proposition to support educational programs and operations expenses. If approved, this proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, replacing an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, to support educational programs and operations not funded by the State's statutory program of basic education:

HOW DO EP&O LEVY FUNDS BENEFIT STUDENTS?

Voters have an opportunity to maintain current funding for programs such as small class sizes, student safety, health services, athletics and extracurricular activities, career readiness, and fine and performing arts programs.

The proposed levy would make up about 16% of district revenue. A levy failure will mean significant reductions in staff, programs, and services for students.

The Renewal Educational Programs & Operations Levy helps pay for:



Small Class Sizes Approximately 130 basic education teachers are funded by the EP&O levy.



Student Safety Our school safety officers, who keep our schools and students safe, are almost entirely funded by the levy.



School Nurses Approximately 17 of 22 nurses are funded by the EP&O levy.




Athletics, Extra-curricular Activities, and the Fine and Performing Arts Most art programs receive no state funding and ASB funds alone are not enough. Levy support is key for these programs.



Career Readiness and speciality courses help prepare our students for high-paying STEM jobs in our region.

WHAT IS THE COMMUNITY INVESTMENT FOR THE REPLACEMENT LEVY?

- The Educational Programs and Operations Levy is a renewal tax, replacing the current levy voters approved in 2020. Kent School District voters have supported school levies for more than three decades.
- The state does not provide school districts with funding that meets the basic needs of school districts across the state. Local levies are needed to fill that gap.



- This local levy funding allows us to provide the quality education our community expects for our children, which goes beyond the minimum funded by the state.
- This levy is a two-year "flat amount" levy. This means there would be no increase in the maximum levy amount that could be collected during calendar years 2023 and 2024.

Voting Facts

- In Washington, a school levy measure must be approved by 50% of the vote.
- All voting in Washington is done by mail.
- Ballots are mailed about three weeks prior to an election day.
- Ballots must be returned by election day; no stamp is required.

Tax Exemptions
